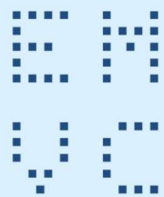

Graduates may choose to continue their education through a range of specialised courses, including the Certificate IV in Community Services, Certificate IV in Disability, Certificate III in Individual Support, or the Diploma of Community Services.

For those seeking advanced academic and professional opportunities, progression to a Bachelor of Social Work is also possible.
